## From Transitional to Transformative Justice: *Turning Interdisciplinary Research into Practice*

*Why this course?* Transitional justice and human rights are booming fields in research and practice. At the same time, they face huge global challenges and threats. That is why in this course, we will present the idea of transformative justice (Gready and Robins 2014): a new agenda for transitional justice practice that centers agency and participation of victimized people. We combine this bottom-up approach, focusing on lived realities of victimized people, with an understanding of institutional logics of injustice.

*What will you learn?* The course will teach participants through lectures, interactive seminars, and an excursion to operationalize concepts and tools of these fields for both research and practice. This course includes and values all types of expertise, including those from lived experience.
